Use this checklist to help with packing. Then, pack the list and use it to make sure you are taking home everything you brought to camp at the end of your session!

Pack in a small backpack for easy access upon arrival:

- Sack lunch and drink if riding bus
- Swimming suit (Daisy Hindman and Prairie Schooner campers only)
- Towel
- Insect Repellent containing DEET
- Sunscreen (SPF 30 or more)
- All prescription and non-prescription medication (It must be in its original container and marked with the camper's full name.)
- Water bottle (Easy to carry all the time)

Leave at home:

- Halter tops, open midriff tops
- Flip flops, thongs, dress or fashion sandals
- Jewelry and other valuables
- Radios, TVs, or cell phones
- CDs and players, mp3 players, I-pods
- Food, candy or gum
- Electrical, butane or battery operated hair-grooming equipment
- Weapons of any kind including pepper spray or mace
- Alcohol or illegal drugs
- Pocketknives (unless Survivor Daisy, WIT or RIT camper)

		2 pair comfortable, sturdy shoes (lace-up, closed toe and heel) no clogs, crocs, flip flops or fashion sandals
		Pajamas
		Raincoat and hat or waterproof poncho
		Sweater or jacket
		Sweatshirt
		Water shoes for the shower.
		Swimming suit
		Shirts and shorts for each day. (no halter or open midriff tops). Shirts for daily wear need to cover shoulders for sun protection.
		Underwear for each day
		Socks for each day plus 3 to 5 extra pairs
		Hat/Bandana (Make sure you like it; you'll wear it a lot.)
		Jeans (1 or 2 pairs)
Bedding (pack all bedding in a clearly labeled, closed trash bag)		
		Pillow and pillowcase
		Sleeping bag or bedroll to include at least 2 blankets; Sheets for hot weather
Outdoor Supplies and Cookout Equipment		
		Flashlight-extra batteries and bulb
		Silverware-fork, spoon (plastic is okay)
		Unbreakable plastic cup, plate and bowl (or mess kit)
		Mesh drawstring dunk bag or lingerie bag for sterilizing dishes on cookouts
Health Supplies		
		Kleenex
		Sanitary Supplies
		Soap in a plastic case or shower gel
		Comb and hairbrush
		Shampoo
		Deodorant-stick or roll-on
		Toothpaste and toothbrush

Packing for Camp

Your camper must be able to carry her own luggage. Please help her pack lightly! Use a small piece of luggage such as a medium-size duffle bag and a small backpack. Use only soft luggage, and please leave foot lockers and trunks at home. There is limited space in campers' living quarters.

Please do not send valuable or cherished items to camp.

Three Reminders:

- 1.) Mark everything with your daughter's name.
- 2.) All medications must be in their original container.
- 3.) Please do not send any food – candy, gum, chips, pop, cookies, etc. to camp. It helps us keep the camp safe for kids and animals.

Please note that loose bedding or sleeping bags are not accepted on the bus.

	Sunscreen (SPF 30 or more)
	Washcloths and towels (one bath towel for showers and at least one beach towel for swimming)
	Barrettes or ponytail holders (for long hair)
Miscellaneous Equipment	
	Laundry bag or empty pillowcase for collecting laundry
	Water bottle
	Small backpack
	Extra key or combination if luggage locks
	Heavy trash bags to put your clothes and sleeping gear in. They also make great raincoats! We recommend 3-5.
	Extra glasses or contact lenses in case yours are lost or broken
	Mosquito netting to hang above your bed (recommended)
Optional-Bring if you want	
	Shower shoes
	Camera and film
	Pen or pencil, writing paper, envelopes, postcards and postage stamps-stamp and address envelopes for younger girls (Put envelopes and stamps in a zip lock bag, so they don't get damp.)
	Pocket notebook
	White clothing item to tie-dye.

Camp Specific Equipment

Camp Daisy Hindman	
	Dock shoes (Old tennis shoes, aqua shoes or sport sandals for waterfront. NO FLIP-FLOPS.)
	Extra swim suit for water programs
	Quick drying, light colored t-shirts & shorts to wear for boating
	Pocketknife (Survivor Daisy campers ONLY)
OPTIONAL	
	Athletic sandals— must have heel and toe strap- no slip-ons
TREK campers will receive an additional equipment list.	

Winding River Horse Camp	
	Pocket knife for campers enrolled in WIT or RIT
	5 or 6 pairs of jeans
	Battery powered alarm clock
OPTIONAL	
	Comfortable boots (Must have at least a 1/2" heel. No waffle soles. "Cowboy" boots are appropriate.) Boots are available at the barn for girls to use while at camp if they choose.
	Half chaps
	Riding breeches
	Personal riding helmet (Helmets are available for girls to use while at camp. Everyone wears a helmet while around the horses.)
	Please Have Already In Your Backpack For Check-In: Your personal riding helmet, personal riding boots, water bottle, trading post money and any medication that you will be taking.

****NOTE**There is not a swimming area at Winding River. Your daughter will NOT need to pack a swim suit**
